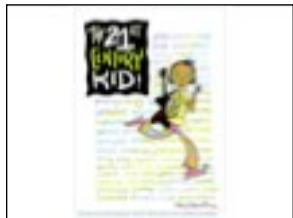

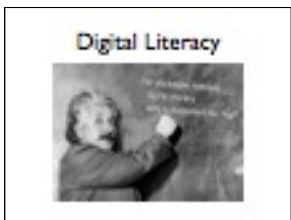
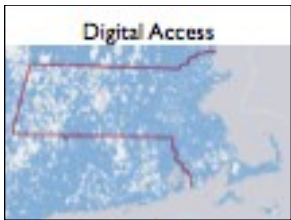

5 Essential Facts of Digital Life

- **Everything happens in front of the world, invisible, and often anonymously as evidence.**
- **Everything is not true, it doesn't get away from you, it's always there.**
- **Information cannot be controlled.** Anything can be copied, changed, and spread instantly.
- **Distance and anonymity separate culture and communication.** You don't know who you're talking to or who you're talking to because they don't see your face or location.
